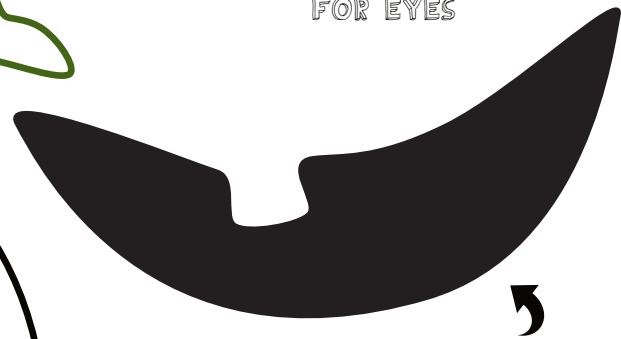
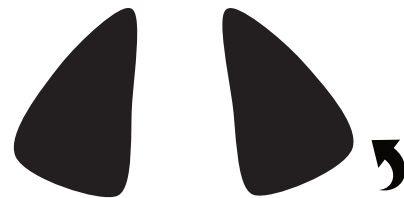


# Felt Jack O' Lantern

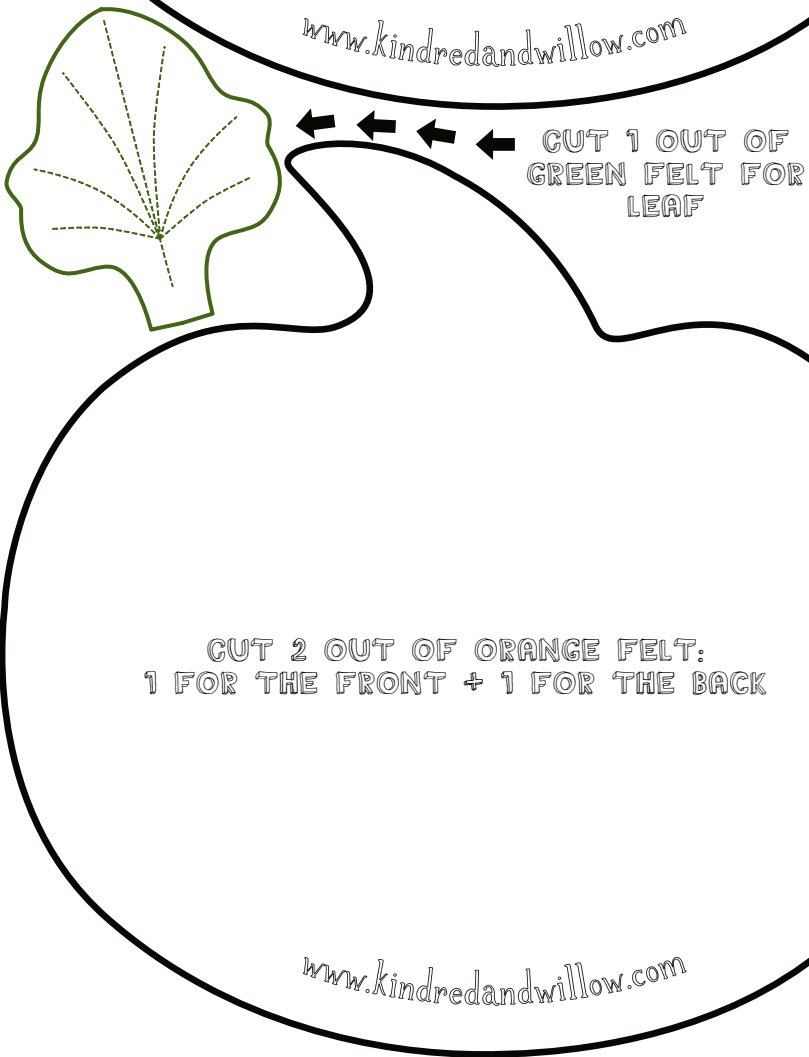
## Sewing Pattern



CUT 1 OUT OF GREEN FELT FOR STEM



CUT 1 OUT OF BLACK FELT FOR MOUTH



CUT 1 OUT OF GREEN FELT FOR LEAF

CUT 2 OUT OF ORANGE FELT: 1 FOR THE FRONT + 1 FOR THE BACK

### MATERIALS

- Felt: orange, green, black
- Embroidery FLOSS: orange, green, black
- Embroidery needle
- WOOL OR POLY-FIL STUFFING

### INSTRUCTIONS

1. Cut out paper pattern pieces and pin to felt in colours noted beside each pattern piece. For the smaller pieces, you can trace them in chalk or erasable marking pen.
2. Cut out your felt pieces.
3. On one of your orange (main) pieces, pin on black 'eye' pieces in the places indicated by the dotted line on the pattern. Sew in place using the black embroidery floss in straight stitch.
4. Pin the black 'mouth' piece in place, then sew on using black embroidery floss. Do the same for the nose piece.
5. Pin your green stem piece onto the front of your main orange front piece in the position shown by the green dotted line on the pattern. Sew in place using straight stitch, just along the bottom edge of the green stem.
6. On your leaf you can sew on some lines if you'd like using straight stitch. Attach your leaf to the inside edge of your stem with a few small stitches at the leaf base.
7. Place the front and back (main) pieces with wrong sides together, matching edges. Pin in place. Starting at the bottom edge of your stem, use green floss and blanket stitch to sew up around the stem. Knot + trim end at back.
8. Switch to orange floss and continue around the pumpkin, stopping at 3/4 of the way around. Stuff the pumpkin, starting with the stem, then continue blanket stitch to end. Knot end securely at back and trim end

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Enjoy your wee pumpkin!
